This vacancy arises through the current incumbent completing her first term on the CNZ Board in May 2025, and retiring by rotation. This position is for a four-year term. The incumbent is seeking reappointment to the Board.

Ideal Applicant

CNZ is seeking applications from candidates who exemplify CNZ's organisational values -Integrity, Collaboration, Excellence, and Innovation. CNZ is committed to diversity, equity and inclusion. Accordingly, maintaining gender equity on the Board will be an important consideration in this appointment round.

The Board is seeking applications from interested persons who can demonstrate experience and skills in governance, including strategic thinking, leadership, ability to influence key relationships, alongside financial, commercial, and business acumen.

In their applications, candidates are asked, in particular, to highlight governance and/or executive management experience they have in any of the following areas:

- Accounting and Financial Management
- High Performance at a global /international level, and
- Marketing and Sponsorship.
